### 3<sup>rd</sup> Open Exhibit in April

Registration for the 3<sup>rd</sup> Open Exhibit is due no later than March 17. This allows gallery staff time to print special tags and exhibit lists for this event. Please be sure to have your registration form and entry fee to the Gallery on time, to avoid the disappointment of being excluded! Registration forms are available on our website, or you can pick one up at the front desk. Please be sure to fill out the registration form completely and legibly before submitting it along with the entry fee.

Although the Gallery will be closed for regular business the last week of March for annual spring cleaning and repairs, *entries for the Open Exhibit will be accepted only March 29, 30 and 31* during the times the Gallery would normally be open. All work for the exhibit must be delivered during this time, and not before, so that the exhibit can be hung/set up in time for judging. Be sure to carefully note all of the rules on the registration forms to be certain your entries comply.

### Artists of the Month

The Arts Guild's **Plein Air Painting Group** is featured in the Artist of the Month showcase in March. When the weather permits, the group meets and creates art at an outdoor location on Thursday mornings. Locations vary, and have included farms, parks, backyards, the Gettysburg battlefield, and the Arts Guild's own courtyard. Throughout the cold and wet winter, the group has been meeting in the classroom, working from photos. The artists support each other with encouragement and suggestions, sharing ideas and techniques.

The works created *en plein air* often form the preliminary images for larger pieces, or can become final paintings in their own right. The pieces on display in March are the plein air works, unframed and possibly unfinished. A larger show of the group's work is scheduled for the Gallery in October.

## Gallery Spring Cleaning and Repairs

During the last week of March, the Gallery will be closed for cleaning, refreshment, and repairs in advance of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Open Exhibit in April. Key work efforts will include repairing cracks and some deteriorated spots in the gallery walls, then repainting both galleries. Some additional repairs in the “kitchen” area, as well as deep cleaning throughout will also be on the agenda.

A schedule for all of the work efforts needed that week is being developed. We expect to begin as soon as the School Student Show is down, which will be Saturday, March 24, to be sure to have the walls repaired and painted before the Open Exhibit work begins to come in on Thursday, March 29.

Interested in helping? All hands are welcome. If you can volunteer some time, we will need to know when you are available, to be sure we have enough work for all hands, and enough hands for all of the work. Please contact the front desk with your availability. Depending on when volunteers are available, we will schedule work hours beginning Saturday, March 24 through Saturday, March 31. Some evenings may also be scheduled for volunteers who can't help through the day. After you let us know when you are available, we'll confirm with you that tasks and materials will be available for you at those times.

## Speaking of Cleaning...

Members often have a desire to volunteer at the Arts Guild, but don't want the responsibility of working the front desk or serving on a committee. A great alternative is to help with housekeeping – cleaning floors, dusting, washing windows, etc. – on a periodic and flexible basis to keep the Gallery looking good.
