

Watercolor Class

These are the materials you need to acquire for class:

1. Round brushes for detailing (two different sizes, 6 and 4)
2. Flat brush that is 1" (don't buy a very expensive one)
3. A mop brush is spreading water for wet on wet
4. Mixing palette, one with a cover is good, with a number of wells for placing your paint in
5. Pad of watercolor paper 11x14, 9x12 or 11x15, **140 lb. weight 11x14 recommended**
6. The following colors: **lemon yellow, cobalt blue, ultramarine blue (Windsor blue or French ultramarine blue), burnt sienna, raw sienna, payne's grey, cadmium yellow, cadmium red, Prussian blue, burnt umber, alizarin crimson, permanent rose.**
(you don't need the most expensive colors like Windsor and Newton. Smaller tubes)

You can buy colors online at dickblick.com, cheapjoes.com or jerrysartarama.com

7. HB and 2H pencil, kneaded eraser
8. You can bring colors or anything else you may already have as well
9. Some kind of board to lay your paper on, like a stiff piece of cardboard, or foam board, or Masonite panel. A bit larger than the size of your paper.
10. Artist tape, white, 1"
11. A little spray mist bottle
12. Can bring a container for your water

I may ask for a color or two as we progress.
