Annual Spring Show & Sale

April means the return of the Annual Spring Show & Sale, and we're hoping the 55th show will be one of the best ever! Members should have received the information and registration form through the mail. If you haven't gotten one, please either stop in the gallery, or find it online. To summarize, members can submit up to three new, not previously shown pieces for a single entry fee of \$25. Bring your art and registration fee together to the gallery on March 31 or April 1 from noon to 4pm. Preregistration is not needed.

All work will be judged for cash awards (unless you specifically exclude your work from judging). This year's judge will be **Anne Finucane**. Anne was the gallery director for the Council for the Arts in Chambersburg from 1994 to 2019. She has been a long-time organizer, art advocate, and juror for non-profit arts organizations in south central Pennsylvania. For her own art, Anne works in a variety of printmaking media including etchings and linocuts, which along with her watercolors are displayed at the Foundry Art Market in Chambersburg. Her work is held in permanent collections throughout the area and has been accepted into juried exhibitions in Baltimore, Washington, DC, and New York City.

As usual, awards will be presented during the show reception, which will be Sunday, April 16, from 2-4pm. It's a week later than usual this year because of the Easter holiday. Parking is free downtown on Sunday; please come and enjoy the show and the crowd!

You can pick up your entries on April 28 or 29 (not before). If you like, leave one or two to remain on display.

Classroom Renovations Begin in April

The grant-funded renovations to the classroom previously announced will begin in April. First, the existing shelving against two walls will be removed. A row of cabinets with a countertop will be installed along the wall at the end of the room shared with the storage room. That will become the front of the classroom. An electric outlet will be installed in that wall. With this configuration, the large TV screen will be usable in the classroom and be visible from throughout the room. After the cabinets are in, the floor will be replaced. New blinds will allow the room to be better lighting controlled as needed for various classes. Classroom supplies will be organized and moved to storage shelves in the storage room or the warehouse. A fresh coat of paint will complete the renovations.

Scheduling of new classes is on hold until there is a firm schedule for completion of the renovations.

Red – Yellow – Blue: Primarily Primary Colors in May

The Bittinger galley will be colorful in May, with work in all media featuring some variation of the primary colors. Member artists are asked to deliver their work on Friday or Saturday, April 28 or 29. This is also a good time to pick up Spring Show work as well.

There will be a **Demonstration Day** with a mini-reception during this show, on Saturday, May 13, from noon to 5pm. Note that this is a time change from the information in the "Gallery Events" card due to the gallery hours change earlier this year. If you would like to demonstrate your art or craft in the gallery for the benefit of our visitors, please register by contacting the front desk.

June Exhibit is Your Choice

Members whose work doesn't necessarily fit a theme or category being featured during another month in 2023 will enjoy June. There is no particular subject this June, just a great opportunity for you to show new or not recently displayed work. It's important that the art shown in the gallery changes frequently so that visitors who stop in regularly – and there are a number of them – can see something different each month. Please do your part to keep the gallery stocked with fresh artwork! Please also remember to remove your art regularly so that it doesn't get moved to storage.

Lighting in the Gallery

If you think the lighting in the front show windows and the track lighting in the gallery looks brighter, you're right! The bulbs in those fixtures are being replaced with "daylight" LED bulbs to improve the "temperature" of the light on the artwork.

Next up will be the fluorescent tubes in the dropped ceiling fixtures in the west gallery and board room. The existing tubes will be replaced with LED tubes as well. That will take a bit more time, since the fixtures have to be modified to accept the LED style tubes.

Successful Member Event March 5

On Sunday afternoon, March 5, members gathered at the Guild for a few hours to socialize, meet new people, and enjoy refreshments. Most board members were there, and had the opportunity to gather ideas and input that will help inform some decisions and actions moving forward. Member Opportunity to Tour Sacred Heart Basilica

The historic Basilica of the Sacred Heart of Jesus in Edgegrove is in the midst of a significant renovation and restoration project that involves repair and conservation of the paintings and sculpture. This includes uncovering painted-over art identified through old photographs. Work on the front of the chapel has been completed, and scaffolding is being removed. Work continues in the nave.

Guild members will have the opportunity to see the renovations and learn about the project on Wednesday, April 19, at 2pm. If you plan to attend, please register through the Guild front desk so we can let Basilica staff know the number of people to expect. The Basilica is handicap accessible.

Plan to be at the Basilica by 2pm to begin the tour as a group. The tour will last approximately an hour. Photography will be permitted during our visit. Restoration artists and craftspeople will be at work while we're there.

The Basilica does not charge a fee for tours; however, members should consider a donation (\$5.00 is suggested) to the renovation project. Please bring any cash donation you care to make the day of the tour.





Give Local York is May 5 – so is Movie Night!

For each of the past three years, the Guild has benefitted from the York County day of online giving known as Give Local York. Volunteers - Track Your Hours

Members who volunteer their time to help the Guild could lower the percentage of their artwork sales withheld by the Guild. Members who accumulate 35 volunteer hours during a 12-month period will enjoy just 15% rather than 20 or 30% being held. Eligible volunteer hours include working on committees, working at the front desk, helping with events such as receptions, cleaning the gallery, representing the Guild at meetings or other events, etc.

Artist of the Month: May


