# Enjoy Paintings Done en Plein Air in October

Members in the Plein Air Painters Group have been painting all summer on location at various sites around the area. Painting in the fresh air as the lighting changes and clouds impact the scene offers these artists a new challenge each week. You will be able to see the results of their labors in the west gallery through October 28. A reception for the show will be held Sunday, October 8, from 2-4pm.

#### It's Fall Show Time!

For the 55<sup>th</sup> time since the Guild's inception, the Fall Show and Sale will fill the gallery in November and on through December.

Members will receive by US Mail the complete information and registration form needed to enter the show. Pre-registration is NOT necessary – just bring up to three pieces of new art (not shown at the Guild previously), the completed registration form, and your check for the registration fee to the Guild on Friday or Saturday, October 27 or 28 from noon to 4pm. Remember, your dues must be current to enter. If you haven't renewed your membership, you will be able to do so at the time you register for the show. As in the past few years, all entered work will be judged for cash awards. There are no categories; all work is simply judged on its artistic merits. Awards will be presented at the reception on Sunday, Nov. 5 (NOT Nov 11 as previously published), from 2-4pm.

This year's judge will be **Bonnie Kern**, the current director of the Hodson & Whittaker Galleries at Hood College in Maryland. She is also an adjunct professor at both Hood and Gettysburg College, and previously at York College. In her own professional work, she has been a contributing photographer & videographer to various educational and business entities.

There are times that the recovery from the third floor fire in June seems to move very slowly, but rest assured work is progressing as quickly as it can. The third floor apartment has been blast cleaned and sealed, and framing for the rebuild has started. Once permits have been issued, activity will accelerate. Some water damage at the entrance to the building will result in the ceiling and carpet being replaced in that area; minimum disruption to the gallery is expected.

On Tuesday, September 26, Walmart Government Affairs Director Jason Klipa came to the gallery with Senator Kristin Phillips-Hill, her chief of staff Jon Hopcraft, and Hanover Chamber representatives Gary Laird and Sarah Messer to present the Guild with a symbolic check. The eventual actual check will provide funds to be used to install and upgrade lighting at the front of the building. Anyone who has come into the gallery after sundown will remember how dark the front of the building is. The improved lighting will increase both the gallery's curb appeal and the safety and security on the sidewalk in front. The grant

was made possible through the efforts of Senator Phillips-Hill's office following a visit to the gallery earlier this year during a walking tour of the downtown arranged by the Chamber of Commerce.


# Silent Auction a Success, Thanks to Many!
